

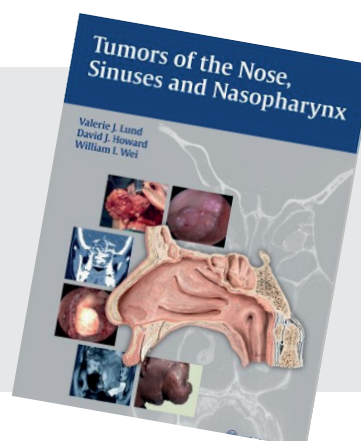
# Tumors of the nose, sinuses and nasopharynx
