Minutes of the meeting of the General Assembly of ERS dated June 14, 2006 in Tampere, Finland

Present: 40 society-members are present. According to the statutes (12.2) the General Assembly has a quorum.

- 1. Opening: by the President. He thanks the Congress President for an excellent organised congress.
- 2. Minutes Istanbul 2004: The minutes were published in Rhinology 43, 74-76, 2005. They were accepted without discussion.

3. Report of the Congress President

The Congress President thanks all for coming to Tampere. The congress has been very successful with about 800 delegates from 62 countries, the weather excellent and a good atmosphere.

4. Report of the Secretary General

The European Rhinologic Society is planning to join the Global Alliance against Chronic Respiratory Diseases (GARD), a WHO initiative. The expenses must be verified.

ERS is founding member of the newly established European Academy of Oto-Rhino-Laryngology, Head and Neck Surgery (EA ORL/HNS). This academy has relations to the European Federation of Otolaryngologic Societies (EUFOS) and represents the subspecialties and other institutions. The goal is to offer affordable courses for residents and to harmonize the training in Europe.

Members ERS:

After a slight decrease in 2003 the members increased to 686 in 2006. This number includes the Junior members. The Secretary General advises the delegates to look for young people and encourage them to become a junior member.

6. Report of the Editor-in-Chief of Rhinology

In 2004 a submission of 159 papers to the journal was made of which 40% was accepted. In 2005 130 papers were submitted of which 20% was accepted for publication. We published 2 Supplements in 2005. The impact factor has decreased from 0.794 in 2004 to 0.621 in 2005. The website has been expanded and as per January 2007, the online submission and management of new articles will be operable. The journal has a strong financial position mainly due to split runs (Netherlands, Sweden, Japan and Eastern Europe). Therefore, Rhinology offered 1 Congress fellowship in 2006 (to attend the ERS congress) of €1.500, which was advertised in the Journal. The journal pays for 6 issues of Rhinology for Regional Representatives from East-European Countries.

 - Nasal Interleukin-5 levels determine the response to anti-interleukin-5- treatment in nasal polyps

8.4 Fellowships

In 2005 five fellowships and in 2006 four fellowships were granted for the official courses of ERS (€1200 for registration fee and partial payment of accommodation). The fellowships were selected by the Executive Committee and the Committee for Member Services (chairman: K.Ingels, Nijmegen NL) out of 68 applications.

- Manuel Bernal -Sprekelsen suggests inviting members of scientific societies of alternating countries to take part in the ERS-congress without participation fee. This will have to be decided by the congress presidents, depending on their structural and financial concepts.
